

Frog Zapper

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS: Large open space



Instructions

1. Ask the children to stand in a large circle with at least two metres between them.
2. Choose one child to be the “detective” and ask them to leave the circle and turn their back to the group.
3. Point silently to one child in the circle who will be the “frog zapper.”
4. Ask the detective to come back to the circle and sit in the middle.
5. All the children in the circle are “frogs” except the frog zapper. They sit with their heads up, looking around the circle.
6. When the detective is not watching, the frog zapper looks at one of the frogs and sticks out their tongue to “zap” them.
7. The victim frog must continue to look around the circle for 5 seconds, then suddenly fall over and “die” dramatically.
8. Each time one of the frogs die, the detective is allowed one attempt to guess who the frog zapper is.
9. The detective is only allowed a total of three guesses to identify the frog zapper. If they fail to identify the frog zapper, the frog zapper wins the round.
